## TRAVEL NOTES

#### **CONVENTION HOTEL**

The Sheraton Indianapolis Hotel & Suites is OHS convention headquarters. It is located on the north side of Indianapolis in a complex named Keystone at the Crossing, on the southeast corner of where the I-465 Beltway and Keystone Avenue (State Road 431) intersect. The hotel is connected to the 100-store Fashion Mall (with a food court) and is closely surrounded by many shopping, dining, and entertainment venues.

#### TRAVEL TO INDIANAPOLIS

Indianapolis is intersected by four interstates and is within a day's drive of more than half the nation's population. Parking is plentiful and free at the hotel. Be aware that I-70 from downtown to the I-465 Beltway on the east side will have restricted access and lane closures due to construction.

The drive from the Indianapolis International Airport north around the I-465 Beltway to the hotel takes about 40 minutes. The shuttle bus service offered by the convention is highly recommended, as taxi fares to the hotel are high at about \$50. Please indicate your desire for the shuttle and preferred time on the registration form. Availability of the shuttle is contingent upon sufficient demand to warrant its operation.


