TRAVEL NOTES

CONVENTION HOTEL

The Sheraton Indianapolis Hotel & Suites is OHS convention headquarters. It is located on the north side of Indianapolis in a complex named Keystone at the Crossing, on the southeast corner of where the I-465 Beltway and Keystone Avenue (State Road 431) intersect. The hotel is connected to the 100-store Fashion Mall (with a food court) and is closely surrounded by many shopping, dining, and entertainment venues.

TRAVEL TO INDIANAPOLIS

Indianapolis is intersected by four interstates and is within a day’s drive of more than half the nation’s population. Parking is plentiful and free at the hotel. Be aware that I-70 from downtown to the I-465 Beltway on the east side will have restricted access and lane closures due to construction.

The drive from the Indianapolis International Airport north around the I-465 Beltway to the hotel takes about 40 minutes. The shuttle bus service offered by the convention is highly recommended, as taxi fares to the hotel are high at about \$50. Please indicate your desire for the shuttle and preferred time on the registration form. Availability of the shuttle is contingent upon sufficient demand to warrant its operation.

The Amtrak station is located downtown and is served by daily trains from Chicago and tri-weekly trains from Cincinnati.

DRIVING DIRECTIONS

From the I-465 Beltway on the north side, exit south onto Keystone Avenue (Exit 33). You will quickly exit Keystone Avenue onto 86th Street via the first ramp to the right. Turn left (east) at the bottom of the ramp, and after crossing back under Keystone Avenue turn left (north) at the second light onto Keystone Crossing. The hotel is about two blocks ahead on your right.

CLIMATE

The average temperature in July is 74° with average lows of 63° and average highs of 85°. The humidity can be high in July.

OHS National Convention

Central Indiana July 11 – 17, 2007

FIELDS OF CORN AND SOYBEANS will flank our bus routes during the 2007 OHS Convention.

Indiana's nineteenth-century economy was driven by exports of grain, and the state remains an important contributor to our nation's breadbasket. Organ building has also thrived here at least since the 1870s. We will hear samples from six Indiana builders and a presentation on regional builders of the nineteenth century.

Our convention will take us from Indianapolis to smaller communities at all four points of the compass in a series of well-planned journeys showcasing wonderful instruments not often given the attention they deserve. Our headquarters at the Sheraton Hotel at Keystone at the Crossing will give us easy access to all.

We will open with gala performances of Rheinberger's *Mass in C* and the Widor Symphony for organ and orchestra by the Broadway Festival Orchestra and Choir at Broadway United Methodist Church on Wednesday, July 11. On Thursday we will concentrate on the City of Indianapolis; Friday we circle around the mid-northern counties; Saturday we will head east. The Sunday schedule includes a banquet and Evensong with the choir of men and boys of Christ Church Cathedral in the sonorous acoustics of St. John's Church. Monday will take us south, including a ride through colorful Brown County, and on Tuesday we will head west.

The Central Indiana Convention Committee has selected a variety of performers, many familiar to OHS members, and some brand new, including several "Hoosier" organists such as Christopher Young and Marilyn Keiser. Outstanding major programs will feature Carol Williams on a Kimball-Reynolds, Thomas Murray on the largest local opus by Goulding & Wood, Bruce Stevens on a vintage Hook & Hastings, a theater organ program by Mark Herman, Martin Ellis at a major E.M. Skinner, and Dan McKinley on an Aeolian-Skinner. We will conclude with Ken Cowan at the showcase organ from Kimball Hall, now at Zion Church, Indianapolis.

This is the Society's first foray into central Indiana and we think you will find a wide variety of exceptional musical experiences here in the Hoosier heartland.
