

## AIRLINES and GETTING TO THE HOTEL

Air Canada, WestJet, Delta, United, American Airlines all fly into Toronto. If you live in Boston, NYC, or Detroit, Chicago or the DC area, consider flying with **PORTER** airlines which lands at the island airport with a free shuttle to the downtown core.



If you arrive at the main airport- Pearson (YYZ) you can

- Pay a huge fee for limousine/taxi/uber to go directly to the hotel OR
- Take the UPEXpress train to Union Station and then a quick taxi/uber to the hotel OR
- Ride the AIRPORT EXPRESS bus 900 to the Kipling Subway station – Ride the #2 line to Bloor, switch to the #1 line south to Dundas and walk five minutes to the Chelsea. It will take a little bit of time and effort but so much less expensive.

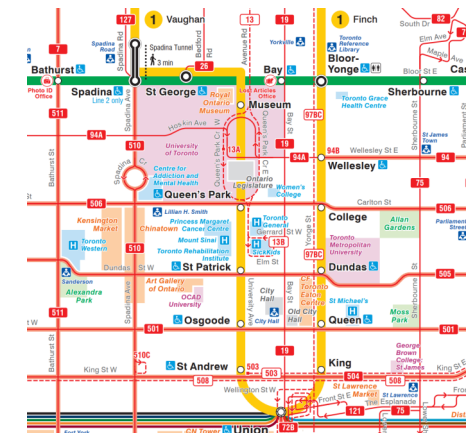
## DRIVING TO TORONTO

Those who drive to Toronto are advised that parking in the city can be expensive. Currently the Chelsea Inn charges \$39 plus tax per night (with unlimited in/out privileges). If that seems too steep, consider parking out by the Toronto Pearson Airport (for half that amount) and follow the instructions on how to get into the city.

## GETTING AROUND THE CITY

For many of the events, you will be able to get to the venues simply by walking. The downtown core of the city is on a grid (like Manhattan) so you are either walking east/west or north/south. All the other venues are reachable by TTC subway and streetcars. TTC = Toronto Transit Commission.

SUBWAY – for our purposes, there are only TWO (2) lines – Line 2 and Line 1. (see the map) Our HOME Station is **DUNDAS** on Line 1. The Subway has excellent signage. The program booklet will have TTC directions. Use your travel buddy, or look for our ambassadors on the platforms. Oh, and by the way, most Canadians are friendly to speak with and can easily help you find your way!
