

#### MESSAGE FROM CEO ED MCCALL

#### **GREETINGS AND HAPPY NEW YEAR.**

A hopeful heart appeals for a year of renewal, rebuilding, and restored health throughout the land. In July of 2020 I wrote the following message to all members of the OHS:

"We have come to realize and recognize the true heroes of our communities, the people who think and act in ways that are bigger than themselves; the people who endure and persevere for the sake of others. Let us ensure that these heroes among us know, feel, and hear our collective gratitude for their selflessness! The pandemic has affected the way we interact with each other. Social distancing, the wearing of masks, and restrictions on large gatherings puts immense pressure on the planning

of meetings, conventions, ceremonies, even family events."

As you well know, the 2020 convention slated for Columbus, Ohio and environs was postponed by two years in early April. It was a decision made in the best interests of our members given the extraordinary spread of Covid-19. In mid-September, a similar decision was made to postpone the joint conference between the OHS and the AIO slated for Toronto, Ontario, Canada. Both decisions were difficult pills to swallow. We all long for the happiness of shared experiences, glorious instruments, inspiring performances, and the renewal of long-standing friendships.

The good news remains that both stellar events have been re-scheduled for 2022 and 2023, respectively. Local committee planning teams are eager to re-start coordinating the myriad details that form the basis of any successful event. For this, we are deeply appreciative.

Since the outbreak began, the management team at the OHS continued to pursue programs and initiatives that further our mission: that is to celebrate, preserve and study the pipe organ in America through research, education, advocacy, and music. One-hundred and sixty-nine reel-to-reel tapes recorded by E. Power Biggs are being carefully restored and digitized. The archives of

Virgil Fox, the American Theatre Organ Society and the American Organ Institute are now safely secured by the Library and Archives of the OHS. A cabinet pipe organ (one of only three in existence) built by Jacob Hilbus ca. 1841 is currently being completely restored by the Parsons Organ Company with Scot Huntington serving as historian. OHSLA Today, a new video series premiering on the OHS website features hidden gems from this world-class collection. And finally, Stoneleigh LIVE presents wonderful organists presenting mini-recitals from the great hall of Stoneleigh featuring the Aeolian-Skinner, Opus 878.

Perhaps the most exciting and relevant news item for 2021 is our plan for a virtual convention scheduled for late July/early August. This will be a must-attend event!

A Kaleidoscope of Colors will feature ten instruments from across the country, played by organists who know the instrument well and can demonstrate its tonal variety. Each 30-minute recital will include a brief history of the organ, a review of its stop list and an introduction to the repertoire. Over five consecutive evenings, view-

ers will be treated to an hour of glorious music in venues that would be impossible to achieve at one in-person convention. Plan to attend one or all the evening performances and let your friends know about it in advance. Check our website and/or the monthly newsletter **OH!** for more details about broadcast dates and times.

On behalf of the Board of Directors and the OHS management team, I wish you and your family a safe, healthy, and prosperous New Year! May we all appreciate the most important things in life and celebrate a slow return to community and togetherness.

This organ was prominently featured at the 1975 and 1994 Connecticut conventions. It was originally built for the Davenport Congregational Church, later St. Casimir's Lithuanian Church R.C. When that church closed, the organ was miraculously relocated a few blocks away in the Fair Haven section of the city of New Haven, and received restorative conservation by S.L.
