

ORGAN HISTORICAL SOCIETY'S 67TH CONVENTION

INCE 2017, we have been planning for another great Baltimore OHS convention, thirty years since the previous gathering. Baltimore was a 19th century hub of American organbuilding with Roosevelt, Stein, Erben, Pomplitz workshops here and one of perhaps the least known American organbuilders, Henry Niemann. Of these builders, Roosevelt, Stein and Niemann organs still exist and are on the program. Sadly, we mourn the loss of Pomplitz, Erben, Johnson and Niemann organs. Yet, we will rejoice in the restoration of a Niemann and Johnson organ, both truly delightful instruments.

A special prelude event includes a trip to the B&O Train Museum in Baltimore city. Not far from the spacious hotel in the Inner Harbor, the museum features displays and rolling stock from America's first railroad, originating right here in Baltimore. Also close by are the Maryland Science Center and the National Aquarium. Both are worth the time to visit and enjoy.

Baltimore is the economic center of Maryland. The convention hotel (Royal Sonesta) is centrally located downtown,




directly across Light Street from the famous Inner Harbor with its tall ships and other historic nautical contraptions. A long wide promenade around the harbor provides stunning views of the water and downtown Baltimore. One can see how the city has grown from a seaside shipping port to an economic powerhouse over more than two centuries.

Baltimore was the center for Roman Catholicism, American Methodism, and America church architecture. Lectures about Baltimore's place in American history from the rockets' red glare at Fort McHenry to the present, the Roosevelt Organ Company, and another about American Methodism are included in the program. An evening recital takes place at the Cathedral of Mary Our Queen, a modernist style structure from the 1950's seating more than two thousand people. Here you find a 130 rank Moller/Schantz organ.

A number of the instruments demonstrated on the Baltimore itinerary have not been heard for decades and have been brought back to life expressly for our gathering. On the first full day we hear a Wilson Reiley organ, (Washington, D.C. builder) then on to a Jardine organ, and a colorful Casavant organ originally dedicated by Pietro Yon. Later in the day we visit a very French Casavant organ from Victoriaville, Quebec, designed by Raymond Daveluy and Gilles Fortin, rebuilt, and expanded by David Storey and installed in St. Bartholomew's Church. The former St. Peter's Episcopal Church, now Bethel AME Church is the home of a three manual, thirty-five stop, forty rank, 1893, J.H. & C.S. Odell tracker organ.

Tuesday's recital venues are all within walking distance. (Bus transfers available for those who need it). We begin at the Old Otterbein United Methodist Church. Founded in 1771, it is the oldest continually used church building in Baltimore. Henry Niemann's last organ, from 1897, is installed here more than one hundred years after the church was built. The organ has been restored post 1991. Organs on the South Baltimore walkabout then include instruments by Roosevelt, Ganter & Schumacher, a 1925 Casavant in a former Pomplitz case and reverberant room and a trusty Adam Stein organ. The day ends with a concert in the





sanctuary of Christ Lutheran Church on a sumptuous three manual, seventy-nine rank, 2007, Andover organ.

Wednesday takes us north of downtown visiting another Henry Niemann organ, and a Felgemaker organ resurrected from the dust. We gather for lunch at the world famous Maryland Institute College of Art and then are transported to another time and place in Corpus Christi Catholic Parish to hear the magnificent, unchanged, 1889 J.H. & C.S. Odell organ. A mere two blocks away is Brown Memorial Presbyterian Church where Virgil Fox completed a rework of Come, Sweet Death on the 1931 Skinner organ. Every stop remains intact here! Brown Memorial Presbyterian Church has the country's largest collection of Tiffany glass windows. The schedule for this concert is set to allow for the best sunlight to illuminate the windows perfectly creating a wonderful sensory overload. The organ at St. Mary's Seminary is a Casavant organ

built from Archer Gibson's Aeolian house organ. It is a stunning sound in a cavernous room.

Charles Fisk's organ at the now Catholic Mt. Calvary Church remains intact. It was built in 1961 under the Andover-Flentrop name and represents one of the very first organs built in this country to espouse the tenets of the organ reform movement. Beautiful voicing and speech make it a joy to hear. Close by at Westminster Hall are the 1882 Johnson and Son organ and the tomb of Edgar Allen Poe. Andover Organ Co. restored the Johnson organ in 1991. Across the city is Little Italy where we find a stunning Henry Niemann organ at St. Leo the Great Church An attached console, made from the former Fourteen Holy Martyrs Niemann organ, enables proper playing of this colorful instrument. At First Unitarian Church, home to two significant Niemann organs, the largest and the smallest. For a change of pace, the Wurlitzer organ





at Engineer's Club provides happy hour refreshment prior to the evening recital. The Basilica of the Assumption, America's first Catholic Cathedral, is the seat of the first Bishop of Baltimore, whose territory included all 13 states. Originally housing a Thomas Hall instrument, the largest organ in the country at the time it was built, the organ was replaced with an 1884 Roosevelt behind the original and expanded case work. Most recently, the Schantz Organ Company installed all new windchests and mechanics keeping all the original Roosevelt pipework. The handsome organ speaks into this large domed room, a design of Benjamin Henry Latrobe.

Baltimore is *the* place to be in July of 2024. The variety of historic instruments is astounding creating a sound palette sure to please even the most discerning appetite. And the food—well, you just have to be here to experience it for yourself.

We cannot wait to welcome you!





Fox left Brown to become organist at New York City's famed The Riverside Church.
